Compak Sporting in line

Steps of organization for groups of shooters, their back numbers and their shooting timetables

- 1. Registering all entries;
- 2. Proceeding to the drawing of lots to assign back numbers to each participant;
- 3. Sort the entry list in ascending order of back numbers from 1 to x;
- **4.** Divide the total number of participants by the number of compaks at the championship, to identify the number of shooters in a group (the number of groups is equal to the number of compaks); i.e. 200 competitors divided by 4 compaks = 50 in each group.
- 5. Draw up each group in the numerical order of the back numbers;
- **6.** Register the groups in the order of the compaks and according to the competition format:

Example in the case of a competition organized on 4 Compaks:

- Group 1 at Compak 1
- Group 2 at Compak 2
- Group 3 at Compak 3
- Group 4 at Compak 4

In the pages below, please find the tables of shooting order of the groups per round, according to the number of days (2, 3 or 4) and of compaks (4 or 8) of the competition.

Recommendation

A competition may be organized according to the traditional system (by 6-shooter squad) or according to the new system, Compak Sporting in line.

The organization of the Compak Sporting in line is very difficult if you do not have the electronic system of shooter group management and the electronic refereeing equipment, but of course we do confirm that both shooting methods (line or squad) are officially valid.

Organization of shooting timetables when competitors are expected to shoot one compak with 1 double and one compak with 2 doubles, one immediately after the other

You may have to stop the firing sequence on the compak with two doubles, to prevent the shooters coming from a compak with one double from being late. Indeed, at the 75th shooter, the firing sequence on a compak with two doubles has a lead of 37 minutes compared with the firing sequence on a compak with one double.

It is thus recommended to stop the firing sequence every 75 shooters on a compak with two doubles, to realign the shooting timetable of the compak with one double; this way the rest period of the shooters and the good organization of the shoot are preserved.
